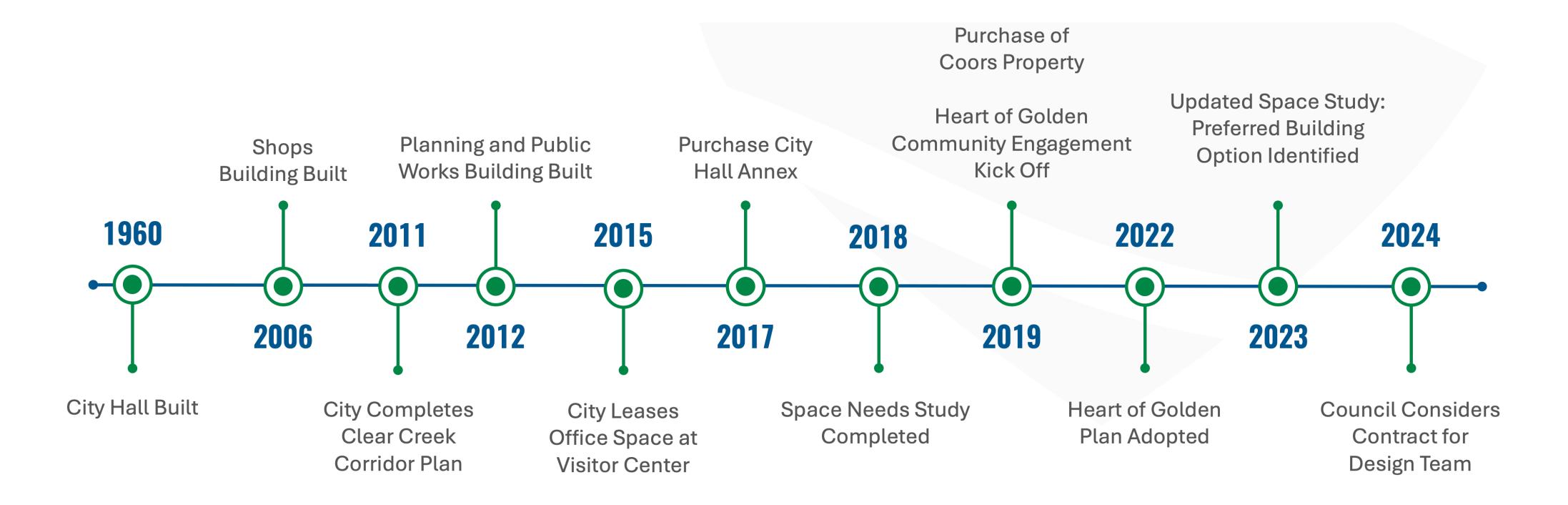

CITY HALL & POLICE BUILDING

The Heart of Golden project aims to make the Clear Creek Corridor more useable and desirable for residents while providing needed space for Police and City services. We need your help to refine the community vision for the Clear Creek Corridor and the proposed Police and City building.

LOCATION OVERVIEW

Police and City service buildings are inadequate, outdated, unsecure, and inefficient.

- Buildings not built for this purpose
- Lack of security and separation of Police and City functions
- Spreading community services across multiple buildings creates redundancy and inefficiency in providing service
- Buildings are challenging for service delivery and don't support innovation
- Do not meet sustainability goals; renovations would be costly and inadequate

2018 and 2023 Space Studies (Before and after COVID analysis).

- Hindered collaboration and continuity
- Dispersed departments and buildings creating inefficiencies
- Inadequate storage for police equipment and documents
- Lack of flexible, multi-purpose meeting space
- Aging and insufficient electrical systems
- Poor indoor air quality
- Lack of suitable space for people and equipment
- Inefficient and poorly insulated walls and roofs

Renovation and maintenance of existing buildings and acquiring office space is almost as expensive as building new.

LOCATION OVERVIEW

In 2019, Molson Coors put 7.27 acres of land and an office building up for sale creating new possibilities:

- Free up the Clear Creek Corridor for resident use by relocating Police and City services.
- City could control the future of this property rather than it being controlled by a private developer.
- City could improve and revitalize the property which is unsightly and under-utilized.
- Changes to the site can improve overall safety and community appeal within East Zone of the Corridor.
- During the City's due diligence process, an expert study found that repairing the old office outside to meet needs would cost almost as much as building a new place that would better support City services.
- Even with expensive renovations, the old Coors building would not be able to meet sustainability goals or provide the same level of community benefit as a new building.

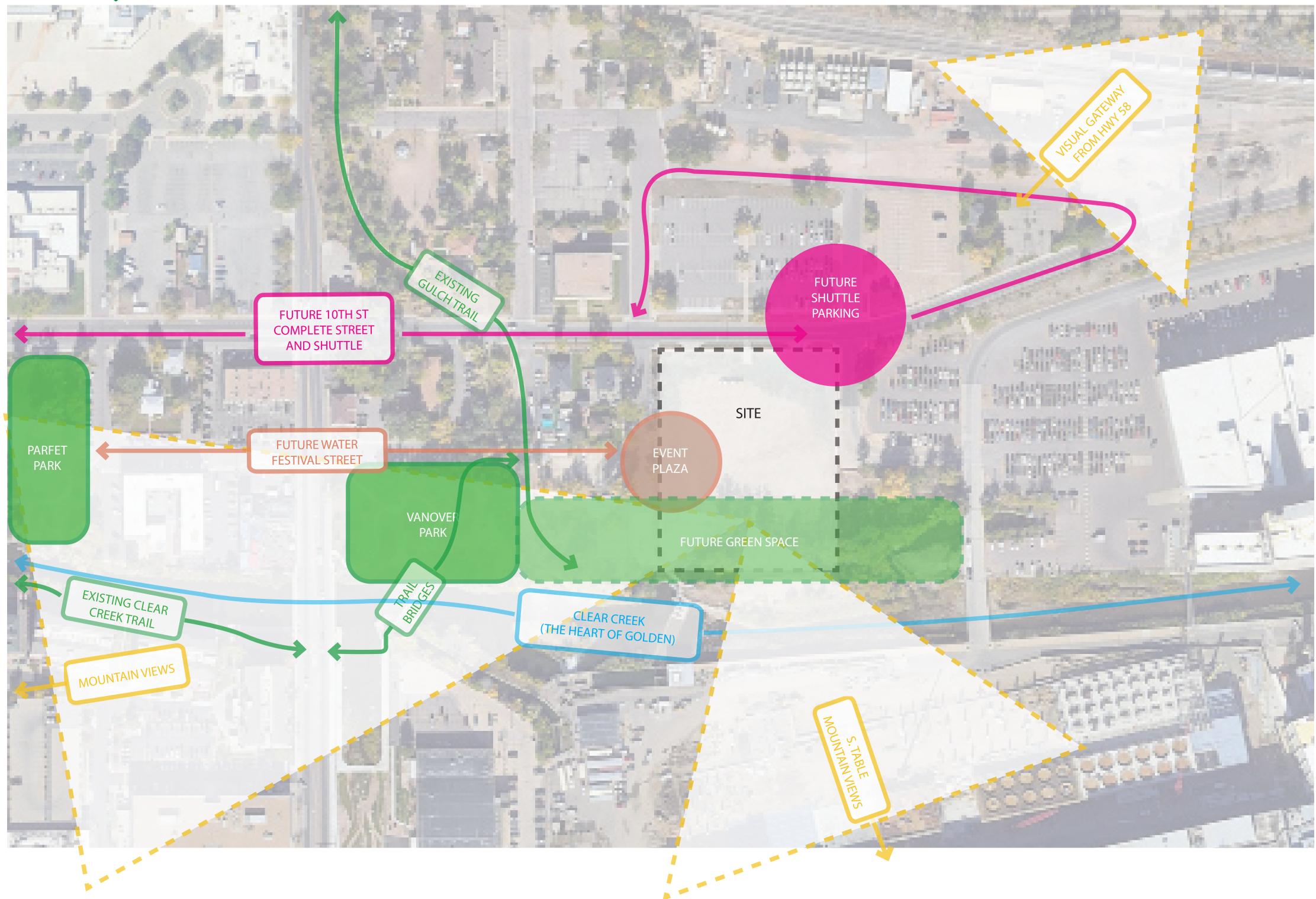
