Lakewood's TABOR History

- **1992**

Statewide voters approve the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights (TABOR) for the Colorado Constitution. Its main provision limits the amount of revenue all levels of government can collect and spend.

- **1994**

Lakewood voters approve permanently lifting TABOR limits on property, sales and use tax for the Stevinson annexation, which includes the Colorado Mills and Denver West shopping areas.

- **1999**

Lakewood voters approve lifting TABOR limits on all revenues for nine years from 1998 through 2006.

- **2005**

Lakewood voters approve permanently lifting the TABOR limits on 1 cent of the city's new voter-approved 3 cent sales, use, motor vehicle use and construction use taxes.

- **2007**

Lakewood voters approve permanently lifting TABOR limits on all open space revenues and on grants for public safety, transportation and cultural activities.

- **2018**

Lakewood voters approve lifting TABOR limits on all revenues for nine years from 2017 to 2025.
